#### Board of Examiners – Guidance to Board of Examiners' paperwork

The information below clarifies some of the 'characters' and codes which can appear on exam board paperwork. This should be considered in addition to the legend which appears on the paperwork.

A single \* indicates a result has not been panel-confirmed. No decision can be made by the Board. If seen on pre-Board meeting paperwork, action needs to be taken to resolve before the Board.

If there is a \*\* after a (2) the student has failed their first attempt and has automatically been put in to reassessment. The Board needs to consider the student's reassessment entitlement.

For any other instances of \*\* it means the module had not been completed yet (usually PG Dissertations or part-time students) there is nothing for the Board to consider other than progression (not to award).

(2) (without \*\*) indicates a capped reassessment has been undertaken and the result has been Panel confirmed.

(1) is very unusual and normally indicates where ECs have previously been accepted but the uncapped reassessment has not yet been completed. This will appear as MA  $(1)^{**}$  and there is no decision for the Board to make.

**Borders** indicate where ECs have been accepted and the appropriate action to be taken needs to be considered by the Board.

**Grey cells** indicate a 'fail' mark (i.e. where the student has not achieved the threshold mark) and help the Board identify if too much credit has been failed.

Any codes other than a grade (e.g. @ or MA) are **POST**-Board grades, and therefore relate to decisions made at previous Boards. You should only see these in relation to previous years (for UG), at the November PG Boards, or for students who are part-time, been in abeyance, or retaking a year:

**@- or @ or @+**: Means the student has previously chosen not to undertake an optional reassessment opportunity. (For UG @ represents E-, E, E+; For PG @ represent D-, D, D+)

If a  $\sim$  (tilde) appears next to the calculated award and class, it indicates that a higher classification could be achieved through retrieving optional reassessment.

**MULTI** should not appear on paperwork and indicates an error which should be drawn to the attention of TAG immediately.
